**Discover the art of quilling** — join us to craft a beautiful keychain using beginner-friendly techniques. Porcupine quillwork was traditionally used to decorate a wide variety of items for both ceremonial and everyday use. These included clothing such as coats and moccasins; accessories such as bags and belts; furniture attachments such as cradle covers; and items made from rawhide or tanned hides. During the 19th century, quilled birchbark boxes became a popular trade item sold to European Americans among Eastern and Great Lakes tribes.
